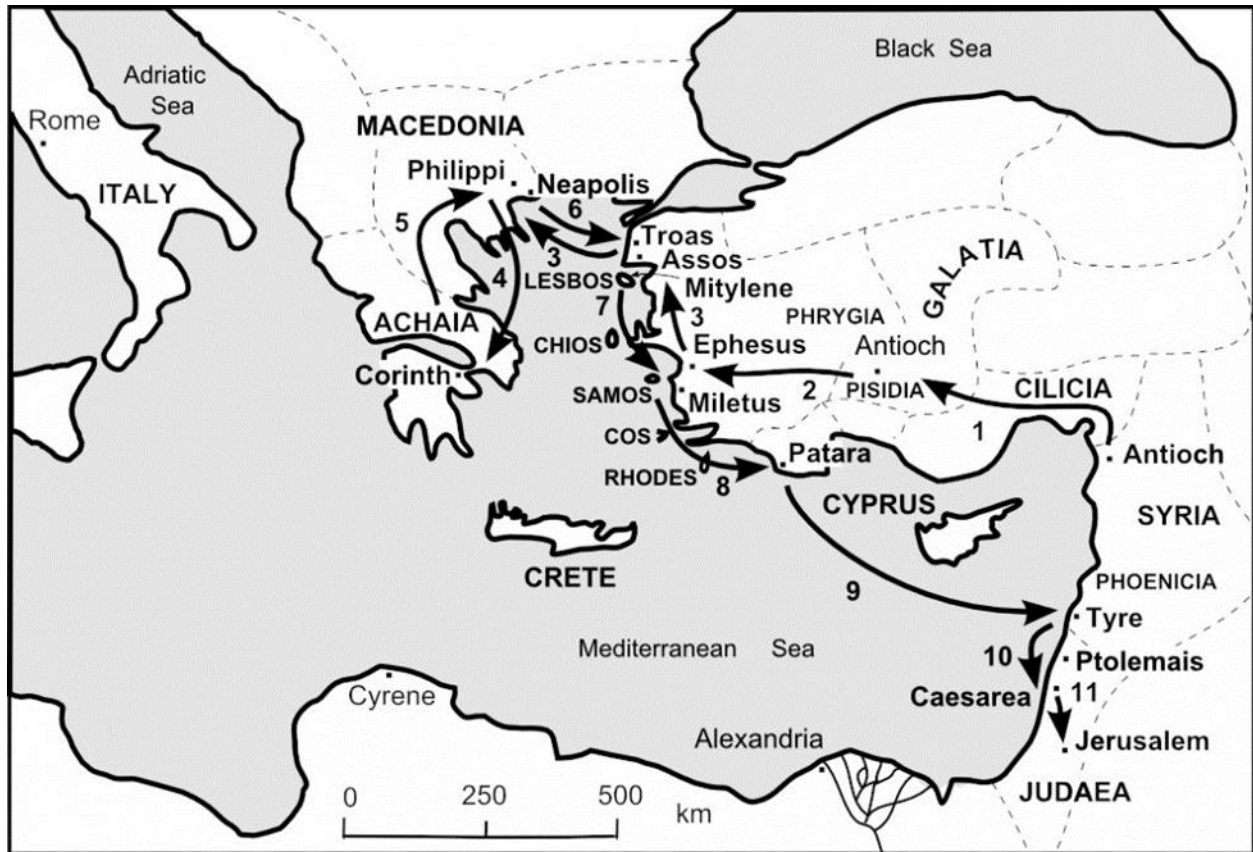


Journey in Obedience

Acts 21:1–16



Walk through the Text through Travel Details

- Cos (1 day) (1) (several hour trips)
- Rhodes (1 day)
- Patara (1 day)
- Sight of Cyprus to the left (2–3)
- Tyre (Seven days) (4–6) (400-mile journey)
 - Warned Paul not to go
 - Sweet fellowship and tough farewell
 - Walked out of the city to the boat
 - Knelt and prayed

Journey in Obedience

Acts 21:1–16

- Ptolemais (1 day)(7)
 - 20 Miles from Tyre
 - Greeted the brothers
- Caesarea (Next day) (8–14)
 - 40 miles from Ptolemais
 - House of Philip the evangelist, one of the seven
 - Unmarried daughters **prophesied (9)**
 - Agabus came down and **prophesied (10–11)**
 - Same prophet who had prophesied the famine the church in Judea had already gone through. (Acts 11:28)
 - Church urged him not to go to Jerusalem (12)
 - Paul's Response (Surrender) (13)
 - Church's Response (Surrender) (14)
- Jerusalem (15–16)
 - About a 65-mile two-day journey by horseback.

Takeaways:

- God is able to direct our steps and we can trust him (Good and bad outlooks)
 - **Proverbs 3:5–6** ⁵Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. ⁶In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.
- We must daily and ultimately come to a place of surrender.
 - **“Let the will of the Lord be done.” (Acts 21:14)**
